Spring (After Frost):

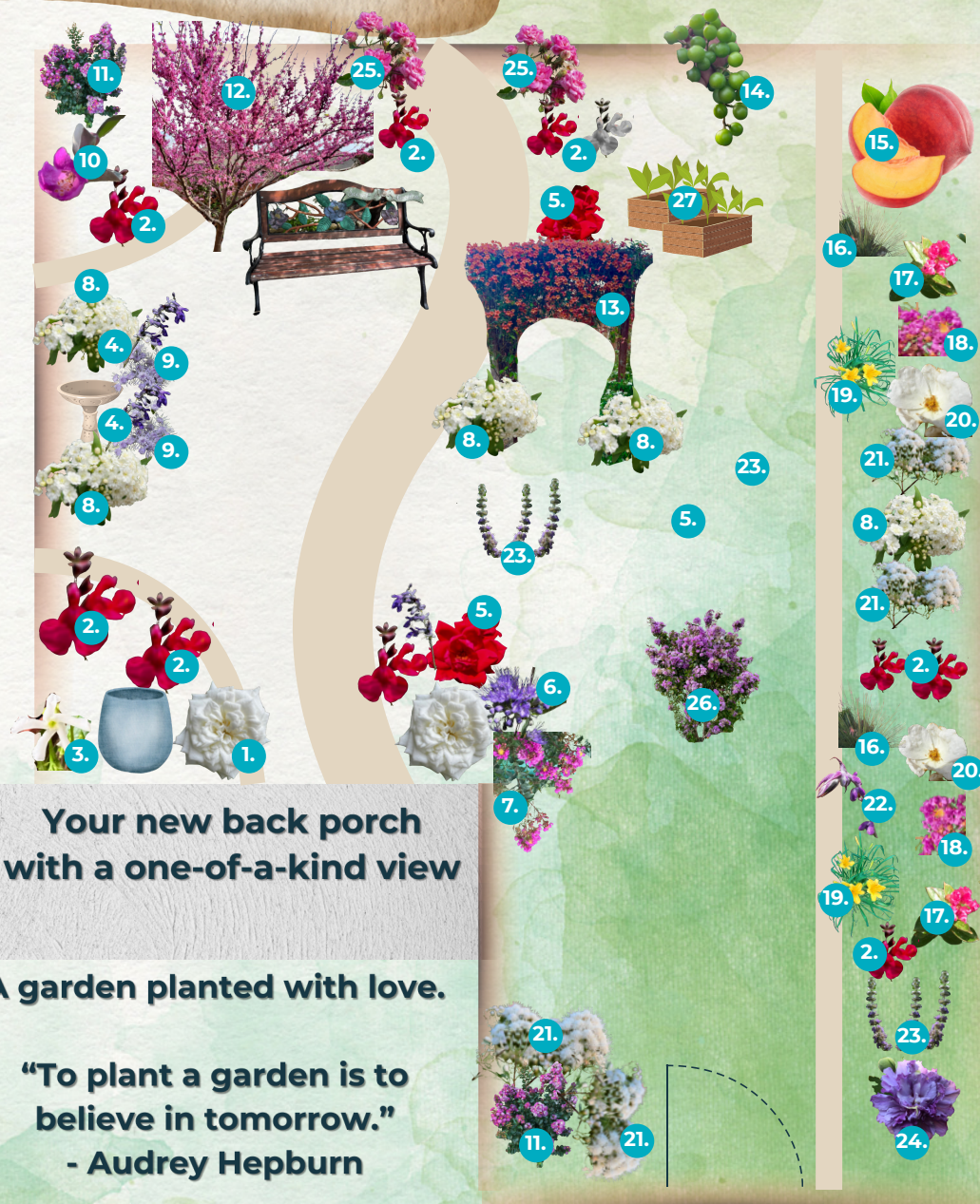
Tangerine Crossvine (After Spring blooms fade)

QUICK TIPS:

Most pruning occurs between Valentines Day to Mother's Day.

If it blooms in Spring, Prune AFTER their flowers fade.

If it blooms in Fall, You can prune late winter/early fall.
